

<u>Legislative Issues....</u>

Governor Lee's recent State of the State address outlined budget spending for education. Gov. Lee has made strengthening the state minimum salary schedule for teachers a priority. He also proposed a new comprehensive approach to literacy focused on phonics-based reading instruction, support for mental health services for the state's highest risk students, as well as other funding for education. During the speech, Gov. Lee also spoke of the success of his current initiatives of helping young adults earn industry certifications, launching new work-based learning programs, and promoting STEM education across the state.
